

Pike County Extension 4-H Updates

State Teen Conference

In June of 2023 Pike County took 6 Teen Counselors to State 4-H Teen Conference on the campus of University of Kentucky in Lexington. Over the course of 4 days, these youth were able to participate in classes involving subjects such as leadership, entrepreneurship, and civic engagement. They were also able to meet and network with State Officers and 4-Hers from every corner of Kentucky. Activities at conference included a dance, Fashion Revue, Performing Arts showcase, and Community Service projects. Pike County also participated in Area Night out which was an opportunity for Counselors to have time with other counties in their area. E6 went to Activate Games in Lexington.





4-H Camp

For the 2023 camping year Pike County took 138 campers age 8-14, 23 Teen Counselors and Counselors in Training (CITs), and 17 Adult Volunteers. Teen Counselors and CITs went through Counselor Training in the weeks prior to 4-H Camp. They learned the skills of working with youth as well as leadership, responsibility, and teamwork. Adult Volunteers also went through a training/orientation where they learned their roles and responsibilities for camp as well as some camp policies and procedures. Everyone was thoroughly prepared for an outstanding camp week. Camper Orientation was held on the Friday before camp (July 21) to help parents with paperwork and any questions they had regarding camp. Teen Counselors and CITs also performed a skit on some rules for campers at camp.

Camp week took place July 24th - 28th at the JM Feltner 4-H Camp in London, KY. This year, Pike County camped alongside Pulaski County. The two counties worked together very well and many strong friendships were made. Activities at camp included sallies, dancing, messy games, party bingo, a concert, classes, and closing campfire among many other things. The Youth of Pike County gained life skills and made memories that will last a lifetime.





4-H State Speech Competition

The 4-H State Speech Competition took place on July 8th in Nicholasville Ky. Pike County was represented by an outstanding competitor, Javan Dotson. Javan took home a blue ribbon from the competition and received excellent feedback and comments from the judging panel.

Kentucky State Fair

Pike County 4-H has submitted 49 projects for judging at State Fair. These projects come from schools across the county from 4-H members in grades 4th-12th. Projects going to State Fair this year include paintings, photography, food, woodworking, and home environment (flower arrangements). State Fair projects were taken to Louisville on August 13th to be displayed in Cloverville.

Pike County youth were awarded 10 blue ribbons and 3 Grand Champions



Pike County 4-H started involvement in schools by participating in Kindercamps at Johns Creek School and Mullins School. 4-H Extension Staff has met with each school in the county to establish a plan for in school programming this year as well as making efforts to reach more youth audiences across the county. We were a part of Redifest at Belfry and the Phelps back to school events spreading knowledge about 4-H.

We have begun going into schools to set up clubs. We are in every school in the county and have added Homeschooling Clubs and Northpoint Academy to our reach.

If you are interested in joining Teen Council, the next meeting is Monday, October 16th at 530pm at the Pike County Extension Office.





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
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Upcoming Things
